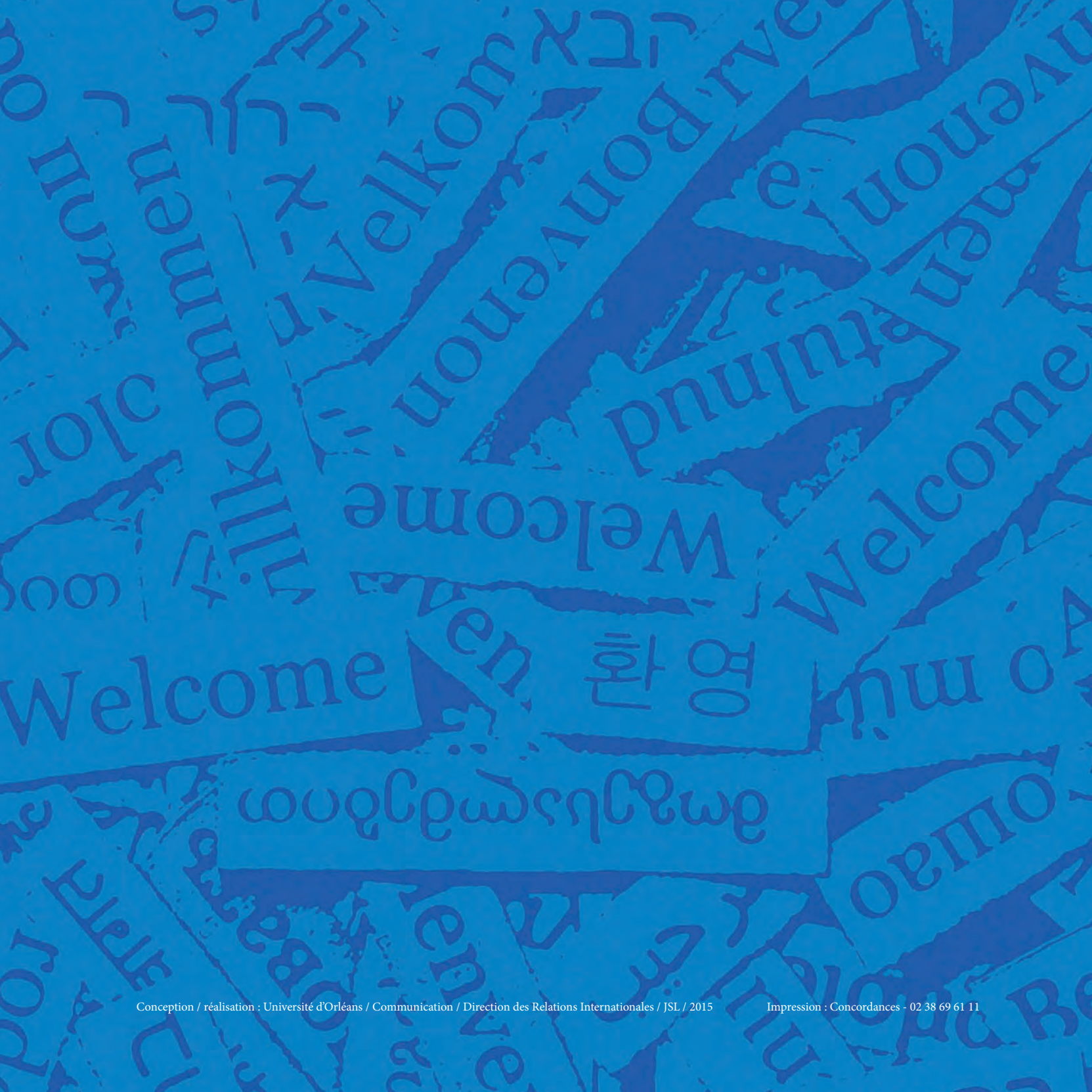


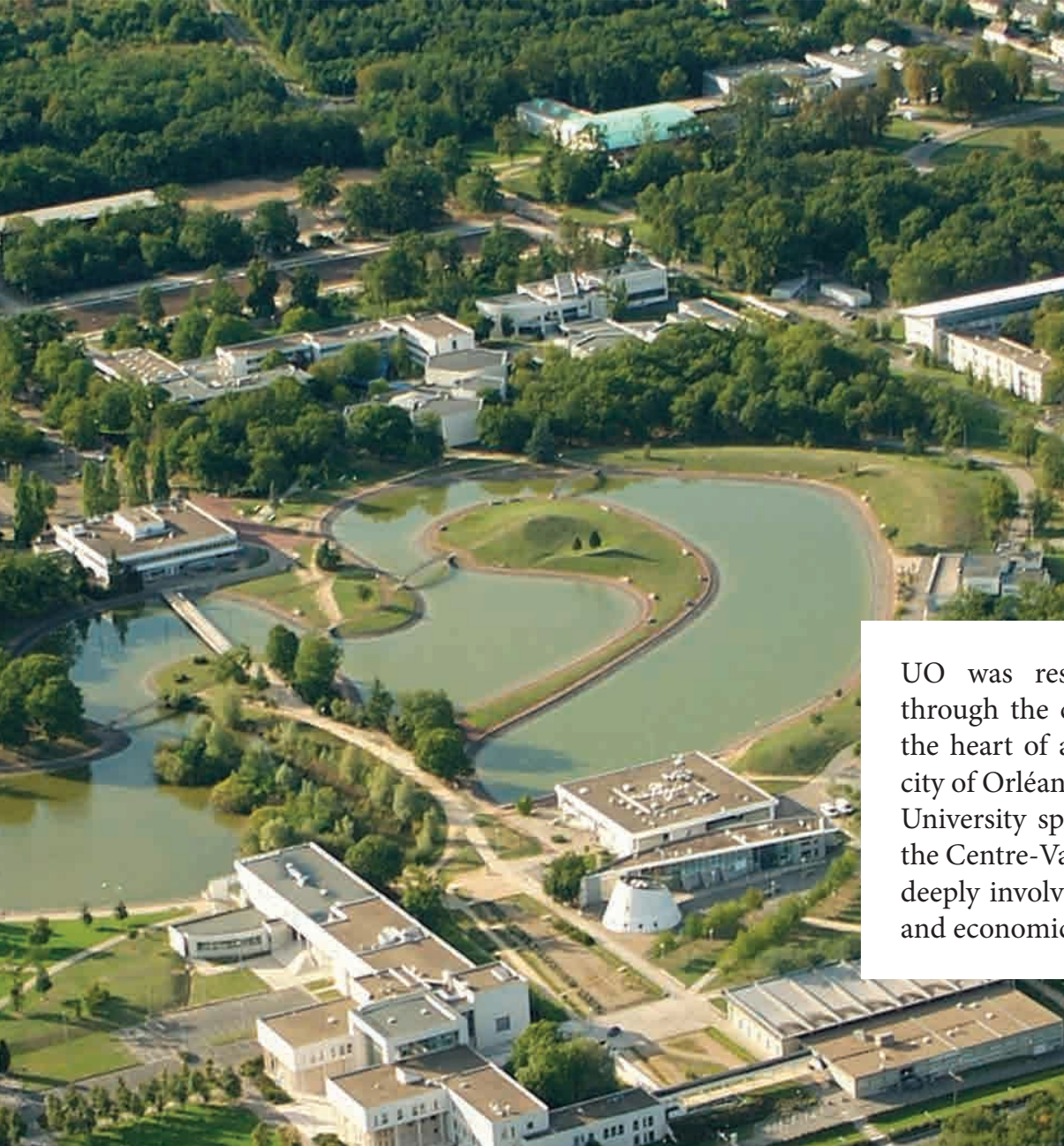

UO was restructured in the mid 60's through the creation of a large campus in the heart of a forested area near the lively city of Orléans. Between 1969 and 2000, the University spread in the 6 departments of the Centre-Val de Loire Region and is today deeply involved in the intellectual, cultural and economic life of its Region.

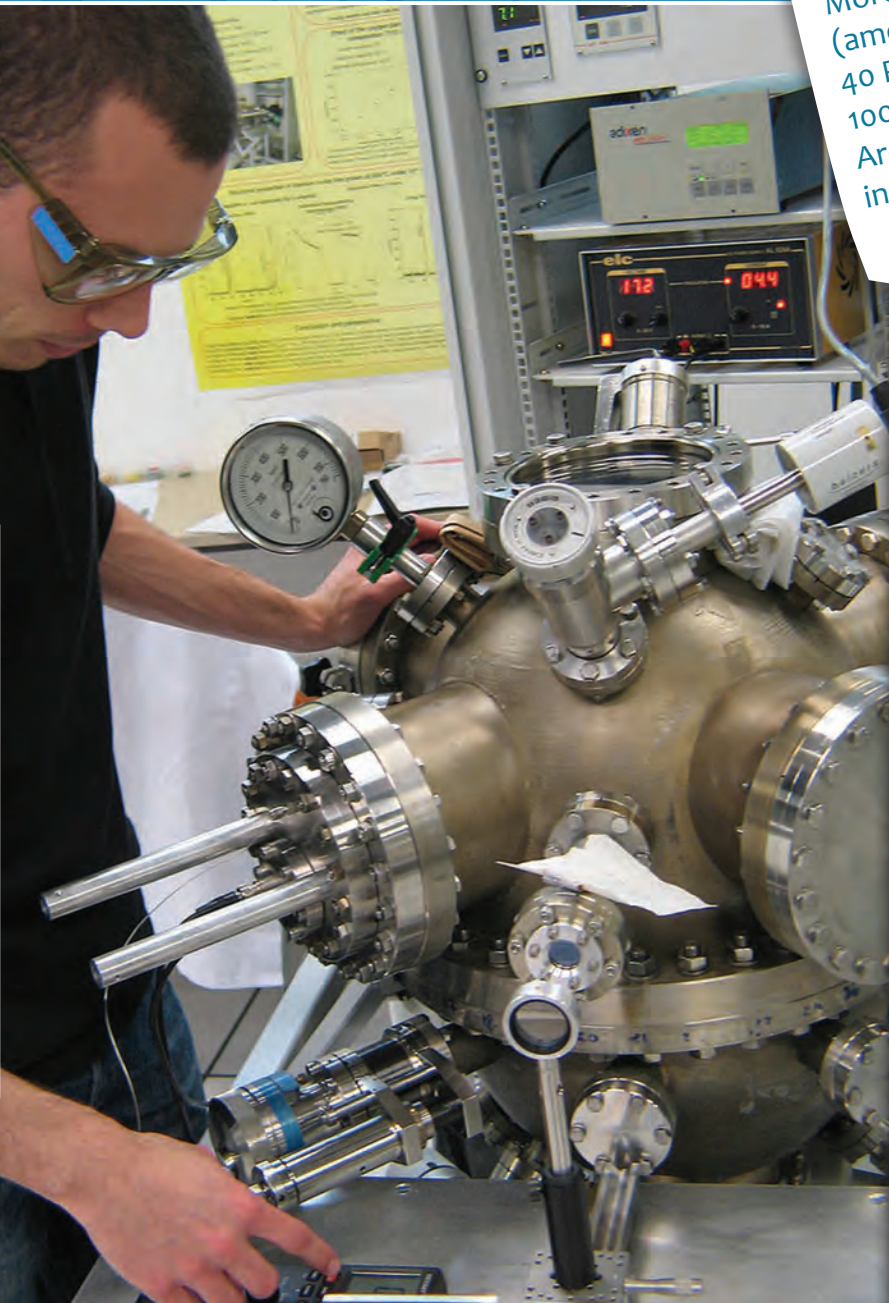
Research at UO: a supportive environment for innovation




The UO is the largest institution for research and innovation in the «Centre-Val de Loire Region» where it shines in several areas. Surrounded by highly important research institutes such as CNRS (National Centre for Scientific Research), BRGM (National Institute for Geosciences) and INRA (National Institute for Agronomical Research), both UO and research institutes work in close cooperation in 24 joint research units.

Research proficiency:

- 24 research units
- 4 PhD schools
- 700 researchers and professors-researchers
- More than 500 PhD students (among which half are international students)
- 40 PhD supervised under a cotutelle program
- 100 PhD defenses per year
- Around 700 scientific articles indexed in the Web of Science each year



Strong bond between research and industry



Frequent partnerships between the UO and industry have already resulted in several products and led to the start-up of many businesses.

The competitiveness Hubs are a testimony of the dynamism of our collaborations with enterprises. Moreover a number of labs are involved in research projects together with a pool of regional and national industries and private labs (more than 50 projects per year). Around 150 joint research projects per year with CNRS are financed by public and private institutions, the French National Research Agency, the Centre-Val de Loire Region, and the EU.

The multi-disciplinary campus of the University of Orleans is wide open to the world. It attracts and welcomes 2,200 foreign students each year among which 20% in the framework of a cooperation program. The University's international status has been reinforced year by year in the field of education and research cooperation. Its policy for international degree programmes represents a major asset for mobility.
